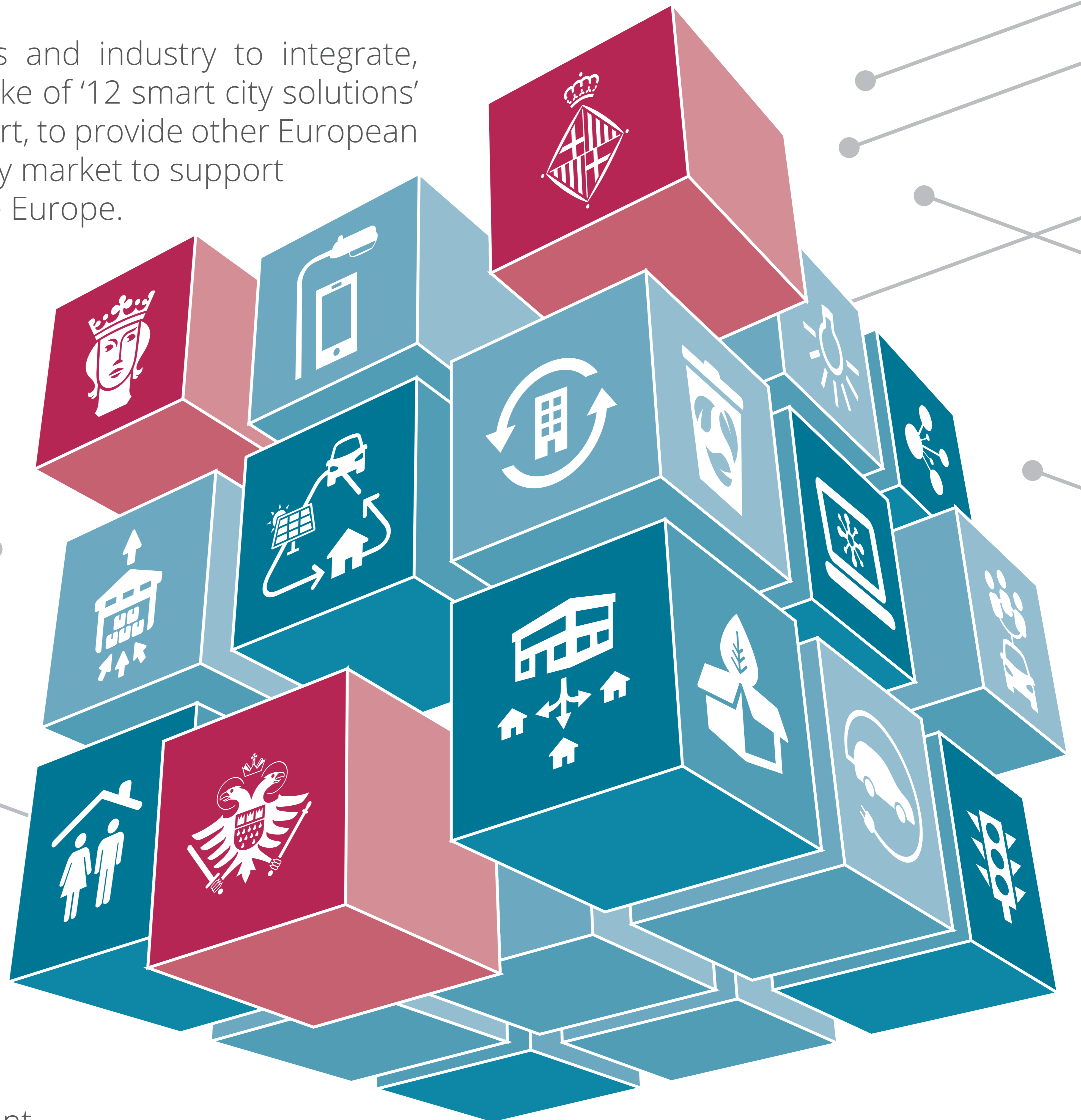

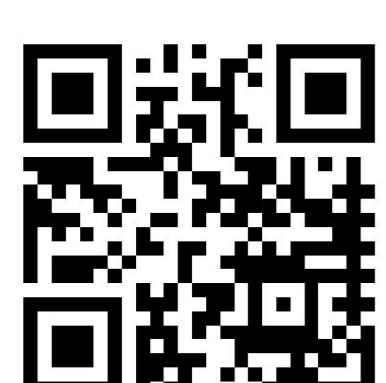
## How you can get involved!
